

Poster Competition

The National Water Week Poster Competition is on again! Primary School students are asked to create a poster reflecting water related issues which are important to them.

Teachers – this is a great activity for the classroom in the lead up to National Water Week. Last year, over 3,000 entries were received from Victorian Primary Schools

Poster entries are invited in four categories:

- 1. Prep,
- 2. Years 1 & 2
- 3. Years 3 & 4
- 4. Years 5 & 6

Great prizes can be won by both the student AND school

Entries will be judged locally. Winners in each category will then be submitted for state judging.

Winners will be chosen using the following criteria:

- How well the poster conveys water related issues
- How well it can be reproduced to promote National Water Week
- Appearance: attractively displayed in colour.
- How good it looks from a distance
- Effective use of art materials
- Originality of design or innovative concept
- Poster MUST be 30x40cm (A3) in size

Any medium, including paper, can be used as long as it is at least 30x40cm (A3) in total.

Any art material can be used including paint, textas, coloured pencils, collage materials, photography, computer graphics.

An official entry form **must** be securely attached to the back of each poster.

Entries must reach Westernport Water by **4pm Thursday 16th September 2010.** State winners and runner-ups will be presented during NWW activities in your Region.
